WHAT IS THE ADEPTICUP ARMY SHOWCASE?

The AdeptiCup Army Showcase is a chance for teams of hobbyists to show off their amazing work to the entire convention.

The best hobby teams from the various team tournament events at AdeptiCon will be asked to display their armies in the main hall of the Schaumburg Renaissance on Saturday night of the convention, to much fanfare and accolades.

WHAT EVENTS PARTICIPATE?

For AdeptiCon 2024, the following events will participate in the AdeptiCup Army Showcase:

- Warhammer 40K Team Tournament
- Age of Sigmar Team Tournament
- Horus Heresy Team Tournament
- Marvel: Crisis Protocol Team Tournament
- Star Wars: Shatterpoint Team Tournament
- Star Wars: Legion Team Tournament
- Warmachine Team Tournament
- Infinity Team Tournament

HOW DO WE ENTER?

Participation is optional, but unless judges are told otherwise teams entered into any of the participating events will automatically be considered for the AdeptiCup Army Showcase.

HOW ARE ARMIES SELECTED FOR THE SHOWCASE?

Each tournament organizer will be responsible for selecting a number of teams from their own event. Generally, the selection is based on a holistic consideration of army appearance, display quality and theme/composition. Please see the particular event packet for details.

The number of showcase slots available for each event will be decided on the weekend (with a minimum of one per event) by the AdeptiCup Army Showcase Coordinator based on tournament size, available space and quality of entries in each event.

WHAT IS THE ADEPTICUP?

The AdeptiCup is a traveling trophy awarded to the "Best in Show" team in the Army Showcase. This team represents the pinnacle of hobby achievement at AdeptiCon.

The trophy will reside in the hall of the winning team's game system until the next year's AdeptiCup Army Showcase, to the weeping and lamentations of the other game systems.

HOW DOES JUDGING FOR THE ADEPTICUP WORK?

Teams will be given a time window to present their armies to a panel of three judges. The judges will then come to a consensus decision, selecting the winning team.

Selection is *subjective* and based on a *holistic* assessment of everything about a team's army/display including, but not limited to, the:

- Quality of the painting.
- Quality of the conversion work.
- Impressiveness of the overall display (in size and/or quality).
- Depth of the lore represented by the army/display.
